COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Study, review, and compare the National Council for Therapeutic Recreation Certification (NCTRC) Standards including changes, updates, and dates to make sure Mason's *Therapeutic Recreation (TR) Concentration* (both courses and curriculum) meets these stipulations. The NCTRC Certification Standards serve as the official guidelines for test eligibility status and govern all requirements pertaining to certification and recertification.

COURSE OVERVIEW:

This course is individually designed to offer the student an opportunity to study curriculum and coursework currently accredited through the National Recreation and Park Association (NRPA) with changes occurring within the certifying body NCTRC to seek and remain compliant with both. The expectation is that the student will meet with the supervising faculty to determine specific requirements to meet the objectives below. It is the responsibility of the student to turn in assignments when due, attend all scheduled meetings, and complete all written work. Students must adhere to the standards of the George Mason University Honor Code.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

At the completion of this course the student will be able to:

- 1. Review and assess NCTRC/NRPA standards' supportive coursework for the *TR Concentration*
- 2. Identify increased *TR Concentration* content coursework to meet NCTRC standards
- Justify changes to meet the content coursework requirements within Assessment; TR Process; and Advancement of the Profession to make sure that at a minimum 50% of the course be devoted to the designated content material

4. Accurately demonstrate how the Field Placement Standards' increase in the number of internship weeks, hours, and faculty supervision can be executed to meet NCTRC standards
